Irina Bokova

Irina Bokova was born in 1952 in Bulgaria. She holds a Master's degree from the Moscow State Institute of International Relations and began her diplomatic career in the early 1980s in the Bulgarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs. She had a political career in Bulgaria and was elected member of the Bulgarian Parliament, followed by an appointment as State Secretary for the Parliament's European Integration Committee. She was Minister of Foreign Affairs in 1996-1997. In 2005 Ms. Bokova was appointed Bulgaria's ambassador to UNESCO and in 2009 became UNESCO Director-General as its first woman in this senior position. Her current visit to Israel is the third of a UNESCO Director-General since 1997.

Ms. Bokova has been particularly active in fostering dialogue and collaboration between ethnic groups in Europe, grounded in multiculturalism, pluralism and acceptance of the other. She has also been active in the advancement of women's leadership.

Since being appointed UNESCO Director-General, the organization's ties with Israel have been greatly enhanced and in March 2011 an agreement was signed for the establishment of a UNESCO department to be dedicated entirely to the education of Holocaust remembrance around the world. Ms. Bokova has repeatedly announced that the organization that she is heading will uncompromisingly fight Holocaust denial.

The University of Haifa is home to three UNESCO Chairs – in Bioethics, Intercultural Dialog, and Cultural Diversity.
